**9. PURPOSE FOR WHICH FUNDS ARE TO BE USED:**

Funds from the Thomas B. Earle Charitable Foundation Trust will be used to purchase two In-Service Home Care Simulators. The simulators will be used by Associate Degree Nursing students at the Tomah campus of Western Wisconsin Technical College campus. The WWTC nursing faculty will also use the simulators to train Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) in patient care. CNA's are an important part of Monroe County's home health care system as they are directly involved with maintaining the quality of life for individuals with disabilities, the impoverished, the very young and the elderly.

At present, WWTC, Tomah has two simulators. The need for more student practice time on the simulators led to the realization that there is a need for at least two more simulators. Because of class size, each simulator has up to six students working on it during any given lesson. Two more simulators would reduce the number of students per simulator to three or less, increasing the hands-on training time per student. Because the In-Home Care Simulators are partial body simulators, they can be stored in lockers to conserve lab space when they are not in use.

The In-Service Home Care Simulator is used to train nursing students and CNA's to treat bedsores, to care for colostomies and to bandage wounds. These types of medical procedures are all part of the daily routine of home health care workers who care for those in Monroe County who cannot care for themselves. Tomah, being the largest city in Monroe County, has the largest concentration of people needing this type of care. The simulators would be a permanent part of the Tomah campus equipment.

The WWTC Foundation appreciates the grant awards the Thomas B. Earle Charitable Foundation Trust has given to it in the past. The foundation believes that training those who help the disabled and impoverished will benefit the community by providing quality care to those who cannot help themselves.
